



Annual Scholarship Award from San Luis Obispo Mothers for Peace

San Luis Obispo Mothers for Peace offers a \$2,000 scholarship to a student whose legal residence or current college or university is in San Luis Obispo or Santa Barbara County, of junior or senior standing at the time of application. Applicants must have career goals that will have a positive impact on the physical, social, or political environment. Documentation of past and current commitment to such goals is essential. There is no restriction on field of major study.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. Write an essay that contains:
 - a) a brief history and description of your interest and involvement in environmental, social justice, and/or peace issues. Explain your career goals, and describe how your education and experiences will enable you to benefit society.
 - b) an expanded demonstration of your knowledge about an environmental or peace issue (two to five pages), and your ability to express your thoughts in writing. A paper written for a class or one written for this application would serve this purpose equally well.
2. Obtain three letters of recommendation from people familiar with your character and potential for contributing to environmental or peace causes. While at least one letter should be from a college or university professor, letters from persons outside the educational setting who know you and your involvement in issues would also be appropriate. Referents should send their letters directly to Mothers for Peace.
3. Send transcripts of all college work to the scholarship committee.
4. Applicants who are considered as finalists will meet with the Mothers for Peace Scholarship Committee for a personal interview.

Only applications that are complete and **postmarked no later than the third Wednesday in March will be considered**. We are unable to return application materials, so applicants are advised to keep a copy of all materials submitted.

All **complete** applications will be acknowledged and applicants informed of the Committee's decisions by mail in early May. The Committee's decisions are to be accepted as final. Mothers for Peace reserves the option of not awarding a scholarship if no applicants are sufficiently qualified.
