Kathleen Sullivan at two events
in San Luis Obispo on **November 10, 2018**



Dr. Kathleen Sullivan has had decades of experience with the **International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons**, which received the **Nobel Peace Prize** in 2017 in recognition of its role in achieving the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons.

She has brought the testimony of atomic bomb survivors, known as hibakusha, to more than 45,000 high school students throughout the United States through her project, Hibakusha Stories. Ms. Sullivan has worked as an education consultant to the UN Office for Disarmament Affairs, and she serves as a Nagasaki Peace Correspondent and a Hiroshima Peace Ambassador. Ms. Sullivan lives and works in New York City.
