Thank you for taking the time to reach out via your letter on July 26, 2022.


We find ourselves in unique circumstances regarding the potential to continue Diablo Canyon Power Plant operations past the current license expiration dates in 2024 and 2025.

While we did not envision ourselves in this situation after the 2016 retirement agreement, it is PG&E's commitment to safely operate our assets in line with the State of California's needs and direction. If the State asks PG&E to explore continued DCPD operations, PG&E will thoroughly evaluate and consider their request.

Your letter raises a number of challenges related to continued operations. I agree that many issues would need to be evaluated and resolved as part of the respective state and federal review processes if the State wishes for DCPD to continue operations past 2024 and 2025.

PG&E is committed to safely operate DCPD and has done so consistently from the beginning. Safety will continue to be a top priority at DCPD through the end of its operations.
