Who are we?





 all-volunteer, local organization since 1969



- formed in opposition to Vietnam War
 - also opposed atmospheric testing of nuclear weapons







 filed as legal intervenors with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission in 1973 in opposition to Diablo Canyon



 also works on issues of peace, social justice, and a safe environment





PG&E Flip-flopping on Diablo License Renewal

- PG&E applied for license renewal (LR) 2009
 - 15 and 16 years in advance
- PG&E signed Joint Agreement in 2016 to close; approved by CPUC in 2018
 - Justification: energy from Diablo would not be needed after 2024, given renewables
- Late 2022, PG&E announced it would again apply for LR for 20 year extension
- PG&E now predicts it will complete its application by Dec. 2023



MFP and Allies Challenging LR



- Friends of the Earth national organization;
 a party to the Joint Agreement with PG&E
 - Dropped its challenge to environmental and safety concerns when PG&E pledged closure
- Environmental Working Group

NRC + CA

- Hosgri Fault discovered by oil geologists 1969, by PG&E 1973
 - classified by USGS as major, active
- Multiple other faults since identified
 - Shoreline Fault found in 2008,
 30 meters from reactor



Timely Renewal Challenge by MFP

- NRC has given PG&E an exemption to the Timely Renewal Regulation
 - License Renewal applications must be submitted to NRC at least 3 years in advance
 - Diablo Unit 1 only 13 months; not time for NRC to review

 MFP, FOE, EWG appeal to the U.S. Court of Appeals, Ninth Circuit



Insurance Inadequate

 No private insurance company will take the risk of insuring homes, businesses, or property in the U.S. against radiation contamination



- Federal act Price Anderson insures for \$0.15 on the dollar given the value of property in SLO County as of 2023
 - Taxpayer money, not shareholder



Nuclear Blocks Renewables on the Grid







- Nuclear plants can not load follow; no ramping up and down output to match demand for energy
- There is a limit to how much energy the Western Grid can accept
 - on sunny or windy days CA has to pay neighboring states to take its excess energy
- Renewable energy projects abundant; costs low
- CA battery storage has increased 20 times since 2019;
 250 MW to 5,000 MW



Energy from Diablo NOT NEEDED to Avoid Power Outages CA

- Mark Jacobson, Stanford
 - No Miracles Needed, How Today's Technology Can Save Our Climate and Clean Our Air
- WWS = clean wind, water, solar energy and storage
- Matching energy demand with response can avoid blackouts





More on Avoiding Power Outages

 CA power outages in recent years happened or threatened only a few hours on a few exceptionally hot days

Some solutions:

- notifying customers to conserve during those hours was successful
- · uploading from solar roof-powered

batteries or certain EV vehicles to the grid during need, leaving 20% of battery capacity for the battery owner (bidirectional charging)




PG&E Proposes Generation of More Highly Radioactive Spent Fuel at Diablo Canyon Without a Storage Plan
